As a reminder, you cannot run OPEN and NON PRO horse show classes together.

Horses CANNOT be shown on a transfer. NO EXCEPTIONS. Horses will be removed from the results and there will be possible implications for Non Pros who attempt to show on a transfer; they will be reported to the Non Pro Committee immediately.

Tough Love 2016

Unfortunately, as we get larger, we need to remain efficient. In the past, the NRCHA office has been fairly understanding in late results, lack of complete data, etc. We can no longer continue to do this. Starting in 2016, we're going to have to really enforce the deadlines and rules regarding complete and accurate results.

Membership

- If a youth shows in a Non Pro Class they need NP Status. If this should occur during your show, have them pay the difference for the upgrade (\$35) and complete a non pro declaration.
- No internet access? No Problem! Email Barbara@nrcha.com for the most up to date membership list. This will help verify eligibility during your show.
- NEW enforcement for 2016: Riders who do not have a current membership by the time the show results reach the NRCHA office will be immediately removed from the results and the show secretary can be fined \$50 per occurrence. See rule 1.1.2.
- Riders who do not have a Non Pro Declaration on file will NOT be listed as Non Pros until we get a Non Pro Dec! If you have a rider that is listed as "Open Only" and they wish to show as a Non Pro, they MUST complete a Non Pro Dec or they will be removed from the results immediately. We are no longer chasing them down.

Processing Results

- REMINDER: All paperwork can be found on <http://nrcha.com/show-management-material/>
- COMPLETE show results are to be received within the allotted time. This includes: payments, memberships, results, and all forms. Incomplete information will result in forfeiture of the show approval fee and potentially additional fines. If you do have an issue with this deadline, please contact the office and let us know the results are on the way. See rule 12.1.10.1.
- When completing the class entry list, only list the number of horses shown. Even if they scratch after the draw, they still get their NRCHA Fee back.
- Post your results at the show! This will help eliminate errors!
- Take the two weeks to make sure the results are complete and accurate.
- If you are not going to use the new upload format or the purse distribution forms, you MUST seek prior approval for your results format.
- Grade Horses: make sure you have complete documentation proving age and ownership of a grade horse and please submit this to the NRCHA with your results.
